1. Why are you running for the school board? Provide the qualifications you have that will enable you to be an effective school board member.

I am pursuing a second four-year term for a number of reasons. First and foremost, I have two children in the Cumberland Valley School District who I want to ensure receive the quality education and experience that is unique to Cumberland Valley.

Having completed a first term, I have a solid understanding of student enrollment trends and its impact on increasing budget requirements. Healthcare, pensions and teacher salaries are the major cost drivers of the school district's budget that require keen oversight in addition to managing growth and maintaining existing infrastructure.

My extensive experience in local government management, budgeting, construction and financial market accumen served the district well as I participated as Finance Committee Chair and Facilities Committee Chair.

There is much more to accomplish over the next four years and I can be an effective leader and trusted member of the board working for the taxpayers, students, faculty and staff.

2. What are your priorities for the school district? Speak to the strengths and weaknesses in your school district.

The main priority for the district is completion of the \$87 million school facility construction project currently underway. Once constructed, the schools will accommodate the ongoing issue of increasing student enrollment.

Cumberland Valley's strengths are the community itself, the current board of directors, administrative team and faculty in no particular order of importance. These strengths function as one unified team; without them, our students and constituents would not experience a strong, progressive school district that it is today.

Weakness is suffered by all school districts in the state relative to lack of common sense pension reform. Until the pension reform issue is resolved, current budget stresses will not be alleviated. Today, revenues can't keep pace with major budgetary costs: pensions, healthcare and salaries.

3. ESSA (Every Student Succeeds Act) calls for K-12 to provide well-rounded education. What do you think well-rounded education looks like at the elementary grades? Middle school? High School?

A well-rounded education is achieved when all grades succeed in consistently outpacing a significant majority of districts in the state in academics. A well-rounded education should also be measured as to how students adjust to their future after they graduate from Cumberland Valley. It's important they become successful at whatever they choose to do or be.

4. It is the responsibility of the school board to serve the best interests of the students. How would you fulfill that responsibility?

It is the responsibility of the school board to serve the best interest of all stakeholders in the district not just students. Perhaps the greatest responsibility is that of ensuring the right superintendent is leading the efforts of the board and serving the best interest of all stakeholders.



5. What is appropriate relationship between the school district and charter schools, including cyber schools, in its boundaries?

Charter schools serve a purpose. They in some cases offer flexibility to nontraditional students and offer last chance opportunities to students who may have fallen out of the main stream education environment. We must look at a better way of funding these schools that don not rely entirely on tax dollars that somehow become quasi tax dollars when they are given to the charter school. While the charter schools can be more flexible with class sizes and infrastructure the traditional public schools aren't so much. The funding formula should be universal and consistent throughout Pennsylvania and the formula should not have an infrastructure component.

6. Given the realities of state support for K-12 and the prospect of not seeing big increases in state funding, what is the appropriate response for the school district?

Just as you face a lack of funds in your household budget, you have to prioritize. This is no different when it comes to state support for K-12. One has to ask the question, "What must we be doing to achieve our goal and what can we do without?" Once you have the baseline, you compare that to budget revenues and determine whether the bottom line is red or black.

7. What is the role of the school board as it relates to the role of the superintendent and administration? As previously mentioned, the school board must hire the proper leader that is the right fit for the school district. It is then, in the school board's best interest to allow that superintendent to implement the strategic plan set forth by the board. The school board must periodically review the plan to evaluate implementation and effectiveness against its goals. The superintendent is held accountable for implementation but also with evaluating the plans effectiveness. This allows the board to either offer additional requirements or remove some requirements as it deems necessary.

8. How do you measure success in the district?

I measure success simply. We have the lowest property tax rate in our region and we are in the top 5% of academic achievement in the state. That is the core driver of our enrollment growth that translates into elevated home values for our residents because of parental desire for their children to attend the Cumberland Valley School District.

9. How is school board accountable to the public?

The school board is accountable to the public by ensuring tax dollars are spent effectively and achieving education goals. The board should ensure transparency to the public and conduct an engagement process so residents have the information they need to make informed decisions about their children's education or the use of their tax dollars.

I think as a district we would have to find a way to do whatever it takes to make sure our children have what they need, even with the prospect of not seeing big increases in state funding. I feel cutting out any unnecessary expenditures would be first.

7. What is the role of the school board as it relates to the role of the superintendent and administration?

The school board creates and updates policies that are in the best interest of the students, families, and staff while ensuring the districts compliance with the laws and following the regulations by PDE. Also, being advised by and working with the solicitor. It is also the role of the board to balance the district budget, building projects, approving the calendar for the year, among duties pertaining to administrative functions. The superintendent and administration make sure the policies are implemented throughout the school, and bring concerns to the boards attention. They oversee the educators and support staff to make sure all aspects of the individual schools within the district are running smoothly and at their optimal potential.

8. How do you measure success in the district?

I measure the success in the district by the students. Are all of our students maintaining good grades? Are we as a district providing the resources needed for students and staff? Are the educators stretched too thin and do they have the help they need to really enhance the student's experience throughout their years in Cumberland Valley? The graduation rate is one thing, and test scores are important, but are we helping these students prepare for the world ahead of them after graduation? When they go off to college will they not only study and work hard, but will they also stand firm against peer pressure and know who they are as individuals.
