NURSING MISSIONS IN HAITI AND AFRICA

Lieutenant Colonel (R) Carol McAnulty is a Nurse Anesthetist at the Carlisle Regional Medical Center. Prior to moving into this position in 1995, she was an active duty Air Force officer stationed in Medical Groups in Nebraska, Georgia and Texas. As an officer in the United States Air Force Reserves from 1996 to 2005, Carol worked as a Flight Nurse on an Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron in New Jersey and was deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom.

Carol began her volunteer nursing work overseas on a mission to Haiti with Partners in Health in 2012. Her first mission with Operation Medical, a Hershey, Pennsylvania based volunteer group of medical professionals, was in 2014 to Malawi in Africa. Carol recently returned from India on another mission with this group. Dr. Neelima Parikh, an Anesthesiologist, will join Carol in her presentation on overseas nursing missions at our March Branch Meeting on the 28th. She is the co-founder of Operation Medical along with her husband who is also an anesthesiologist.

Previously scheduled co-presenter and nursing missionary Diana Davidson will not be with us as she passed away suddenly in December 2016.

EQUAL PAY DAY APRIL 4, 2017

The gender pay gap is a primary issue for AAUW, and one that we have been working on for years. As early as 1922, AAUW's legislative program called for a reclassification of the U.S. Civil Service and repeal of salary restrictions in the Women's Bureau. In 1955, AAUW supported a bill introduced by Reps. Edith Green (D-OR) and Edith Rogers (R-MA) requiring "equal pay for work of comparable value requiring comparable skills."

While the gender pay gap has narrowed, women are still not receiving equal pay for equal work. The median earnings for full time, year round work for women are 80% of what men earn. In Pennsylvania, it is 79%. And, for the Congressional Districts were our members live, it is worse. PA-11, Congressman Barletta 77.4% and PA-4, Congressman Perry 74.9%.
