DEVELOPING PROSTHETICS FOR WOUNDED WARRIORS

Dr. Wendy Dean, branch speaker for the May meeting "cannot imagine working for a better mission." As a medical officer working for the Department of Defense, she is a part of a Ft. Detrick program that manages funding for scientific researchers who are developing regenerative technologies, hand and face transplants and advanced prosthetics. The program's goal is to restore form, function and appearance to wounded service members who have had catastrophic injuries. In order to decide which research will be funded, members must understand not only the devastation these injuries have on an individual basis, but which have the greatest impact on a societal level.

A Carlisle resident, Dr. Dean is a graduate of Smith College and University of Massachusetts. She completed her residencies at Dartmouth, first in surgery and then in psychiatry. She is a board certified psychiatrist.

The branch looks forward to hosting Dr. Dean at the last meeting of the year on Tuesday, May 23 at 7:00 P.M. in the side rooms of the Holland Union Building. As always, members are welcome to invite guests.

AAUW National elections are underway. Every two years AAUW members have a unique opportunity to shape the future of this storied organization. This year we are voting for Board Chair, Board Vice Chair, Board Directors, proposed changes to bylaws, Public Policy Program and resolutions. Go to <u>http://www.aauw.org/resource/national-election/</u> for voter guides, candidate profiles, bylaw changes, and new Public Policy Program.

AAUW members in good standing with up-to-date email addresses with the AAUW national office received an email with instructions to vote online. This email contained a unique, personalized link that will allow members to vote online without having to provide their member ID or voter pin. Because the personalized email is unique to each member, it CANNOT be shared. Please do not delete this email until after you voted. You can also navigate to the online ballot from the AAUW homepage and then enter your member ID and voter PIN. Those numbers will be included in the voter email and on the back of your Spring Outlook magazine.

We work hard on GOTV (Get Out The Vote) campaigns. It is now time to get out OUR vote. Polls close June 15th.

All AAUW members are eligible to vote in the national AAUW election. You are electing not only the national board members but also voting on Bylaw amendments and the proposed Public Policy program changes for the next biennial. Each of you should have received the Spring 2017 *Outlook* in which you will find all the information you need to vote. The voting section is at the end starting on page E2.

While National would prefer online voting, I realize that some of you do not have access to this or prefer to do a paper ballot. **Please be aware that if you plan to vote via paper ballot you must call 800-326-2289 by May 4th to request the ballot be mailed to you**. When you call, be sure to have your copy of *Outlook* handy because your AAUW ID number and voter PIN numbers are on the back cover next to the address label. You need this information when you call but if you can't come up with it I feel sure that they will help you via the phone.


