Linda is a part of the Letter Writing Brigade for Amnesty International. She writes on behalf of people all over the world who have been unlawfully imprisoned. Her letters go to government officials to help obtain the release of these people from prison.

Since Linda has spent a lifetime of advocacy, it is no surprise that she is interested in participating in Public Policy activities. She lives in Carlisle with two adorable rescued cats named Mickey and Sugar.
