

Equal Pay Day Opportunity! Please Come!

The pay gap affects women from all backgrounds, at all ages, and of all levels of educational achievement, although earnings and the gap vary depending on a woman's individual situation. Not only is there a gender pay gap, there is also a racial pay gap with women of color generally experiencing a wider financial divide.

In 2018, African American women will finally "catch-up" to the 2017 income of their white male counterparts on August 7th. African American, American Indian, Pacific Islander and Latina women all lag behind non-Hispanic white and Asian women.

AAUW Carlisle has partnered with Bethel AME Church, Hope Station and YWCA Carlisle to present an evening of discussion around this ongoing problem in recognition of **African American Women Equal Pay Day**. Please join us for this event, which will be moderated by **Pat LaMarche**, a local activist, author and advocate. AAUW Carlisle's own **Donna Bickford**, (pictured right) Director of Dickinson College's Women's and Gender Resource Center and **Stacey Moultry**, (pictured right) visiting instructor in American Studies at Dickinson College, will be our discussion leaders and inform the attendees about the gender pay gap, especially for women of color, and how we all can push for positive change.

AAUW News

You will remember the AAUW Board of Directors put forth three bylaw amendments for member vote. 19.8% of members nationwide voted. Thank you to all AAUW Carlisle members who took the time to understand the issues and to vote. Pennsylvania had 19.1% turnout. You received an email from Kimberly Churches, AAUW CEO, on June 11th with the results. In case you missed it, an excerpt is included below.

The results from the vote this year can be found [here](#), and more detail and information about voting in your state is also available on the website. In summary:

- Proposal #1 to create staggered board terms passed. Staggered terms will affect elected and appointed AAUW Board members starting terms in 2019. More information will be available during the application and election periods in the coming year, and the AAUW Governance Committee will work closely with the AAUW Nominating Committee and staff to ensure a smooth transition.
- Proposal #2 to allow non-AAUW member eligibility to Board did not meet the percentage required to pass.
- Proposal #3 to remove the educational requirement to AAUW membership did not meet the percentage required to pass.

Broken Ladders: Barriers to Women's Representation in Nonprofit Leadership is AAUW's newest research, released in May. This explores the broken ladders to advancement that women face even in sectors where they make up the majority of workers: at nonprofit organizations, in postsecondary education, and at philanthropic foundations. <https://www.aauw.org/research/broken-ladders/>

AAUW's fellowships and grants is celebrating 130 years of helping scholars and activists overcome the barriers to their education and advancement. Recipients have become leaders in business, government, academia, community activism, the arts, and the sciences. Victoria, The Queen by Julia Baird

When Victoria was born, in 1819, the world was a very different place. Revolution would threaten many of Europe's monarchies in the coming decades. In Britain, a generation of royals had indulged their whims at the public's expense, and republican sentiment was growing. The Industrial Revolution was transforming the landscape, and the British Empire was commanding ever larger tracts of the globe. In a world where women were often powerless, during a century roiling with change, Victoria went on to rule the most powerful country on earth with a decisive hand.

Fifth in line to the throne at the time of her birth, Victoria was an ordinary woman thrust into an extraordinary role. As a girl, she defied her mother's meddling and an adviser's bullying, forging an iron will of her own. As a teenage queen, she eagerly grasped the crown and relished the freedom it brought her. At twenty, she fell passionately in love with Prince Albert of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha, eventually giving birth to nine children. She loved sex and delighted in power. She was outspoken with her ministers, overstepping conventional boundaries and asserting her opinions. After the

death of her adored Albert, she began a controversial, intimate relationship with her servant John Brown. She survived eight assassination attempts over the course of her lifetime. And as science, technology, and democracy were dramatically reshaping the world, Victoria was a symbol of steadfastness and security—queen of a quarter of the world's population at the height of the British Empire's reach.

Drawing on sources that include fresh revelations about Victoria's relationship with John Brown, Julia Baird brings vividly to life the fascinating story of a woman who struggled with so many of the things we do today: balancing work and family, raising children, navigating marital strife, losing parents, combating anxiety and self-doubt, finding an identity, searching for meaning.
