The Geography (and Psychology) of a Sweepstakes Scam

We would all like to think we are too smart and too aware to be taken in by any of the internet and telephone scamming that is prevalent in our world today. Holly Smith certainly never imagined that her mother, a sharp, financially savvy retired professional with high intelligence would be victimized by dozens of sweepstakes scammers. Yet within less than a year more than \$300,000 had been stolen from her!

How did this happen? Holly, an AAUW Carlisle branch member, will tell this story and the story of the subsequent massive and difficult clean up effort at the September 25 branch meeting. She will relate her personal story as well as offer information about how the brain responds when a seasoned scammer dangles phantom riches in front of a potential victim. Her presentation will reveal how scammers extract information from their victims to create a faux friendship, making it nearly impossible to stop sending money once transactions have begun.

Holly will describe different types of scams and will alert us to the symptoms of being "under the ether" in order to avoid being victimized. Additionally, she will discuss her mother's behavior while the scams were occurring...signs of trouble that were ignored and allowed the scams to persist.

Holly Smith lives in Carlisle with her husband and two sons. She works part time as an environmental educator for Audubon Pennsylvania. She cites two books as additional research for her work with scamming: *Weapons of Fraud* and *Outsmarting the Scam Artist*, both by Doug Shadel.
