Below is the fiscal year-end status of the strategic plan.

Ad hoc fundraising committee. 
Tuesday, May 28th was a magnificent evening! Thank you to the 95th Anniversary Celebration Committee, for planning and executing a wonderful celebration.

Summer Program for Youth (SPY)

This summer you have an opportunity to impact a local program for children.

The Summer Program for Youth (SPY) has asked AAUW Carlisle to sponsor a week of volunteers. Spy is a United Way agency that is dedicated to providing an 8-week program of academic and social enrichment for fifty 2nd and 3rd grade students in the Carlisle and South Middleton School districts who have been recommended by their counselors and teachers. The program is funded by United Way grants, and community donations and is provided at no cost to the parents. With their SPY counselors, who are all certified teachers or college students majoring in education, the students work on reading, math, and social skills. They take a field trip each week, go swimming, play games, and also participate in art, writing, and music activities. Volunteers are used to help keep the administrative costs to a minimum.
