Before the impact of COVID-19, I wrote a newsletter article to invite you to our Higher Education Scholarship Banquet on April 28. It is always a highlight of our year, and the Scholarship Committee is especially excited about the recipients. Regrettably, this year we must cancel. We will not be able to celebrate our recipients in person –but we will celebrate. Read on for details.

On March 10, six scholarship candidates were presented to Board for approval. All the young women presented well and represented schools from University of Pittsburgh to Shippensburg University to Penn State and Salus University. The committee was impressed with the diversity of concentration of studies as well as the individual family situations and yet, the students are striving for success! Included was a previous winner of the scholarship from 2019.

Six is a record number of \$1500 scholarships awarded in one year. The generosity of this branch continues to reflect the mission of AAUW to promote higher education for young women. (See next article for details). Thank you everyone for making this a reality for these deserving students.

Without a banquet to celebrate, the Scholarship Committee will present the recipients in a special publication around the time of April 28—the banquet date. # News from National AAUW Update

#### **AAUW** and the Impact of the Corornavirus

Our mission to advance equity won't change; we'll just adapt how we get there. Our work has never been more relevant. AAUW's research shows that women stand to lose the most when financial disruptions hit, since they have more debt, lower pay and less retirement savings than men. #### NCCWSL (National Conference for College Women Student Leaders)

As a result of the ongoing concerns regarding COVID-19 and the impact from travel restrictions and need for physical distancing, AAUW's National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL) 2020 that was scheduled to take place May 27-30, 2020, at the University of Maryland, College Park has been postponed. This heartbreaking decision is responsive to the advice of health authorities and the World Health Organization (WHO) who have declared a global pandemic. AAUW's first priority is the health and welfare of our dedicated staff, NCCWSL participants and the campus community.

NOTE: AAUW Carlisle donated \$500 to AAUW Pennsylvania to provide a scholarship for NCCWSL. It will be held for 2021.

#### Equal Pay Day – March 31

Kim Churches, CEO of the American Association of University Women, issued this statement in advance of Equal Pay Day, which will be marked on March 31.

"The COVID-19 pandemic is creating a seismic shift in our lives and in the U.S. economy. Our hearts go out to everyone impacted by this crisis — as does our promise to work even harder on their behalf. In these challenging times, we are doubling down on our efforts to fight for the economic security of American women and their families, as we have done for the past 140 years.

This is typically the time we mark the annual Equal Pay Day, when women symbolically catch up to men's average earnings from the previous year. In addition to noting this date (March 31), this year we are taking a wider view to focus on how the pandemic is amplifying and exacerbating all of the nation's economic inequities.

The issues we have long been fighting for are now alarmingly urgent: Low-wage workers — 54 percent of whom are women — are bearing the brunt of the coronavirus pandemic as they lose jobs by the millions. Those who've been working part time — again predominantly women — often don't have basic employee benefits, including health insurance coverage. The increasing numbers of gig workers also have no benefits.

The nation's lack of paid sick and family leave is endangering both the physical and economic wellbeing of countless American families. Retired women — who are twice as likely as men to be living at or below the poverty line — are more vulnerable than ever. And the burden of student debt — two-thirds of which is held by women — feels especially onerous for those who are unemployed.

We are confident that the severity of the crisis will eventually lessen, and as it does, society will turn its collective attention to rebuilding the economy. Throughout the coming weeks, months and years, AAUW will accelerate our efforts to address the persistent and underlying inequities that are crucial for a full recovery. Together we can ensure that we end up with a better, more economically secure world for women, their families and society as a whole."

#### **Branch Dues Increase**

Our dues have been at \$13 since the late 1980's. As our branch grows, members have expressed interest in expanding our reach, increasing our visibility, and partnering with other organizations. At the heart of it all is our mission to advocate on behalf of women and girls. Evaluating our dues amount was a topic identified in the branch's member survey. At the January 14 Board Meeting, a motion was made to increase branch dues to \$20 per year. This is a \$7 increase overall, from \$82 to \$89 per year. With consideration to increases in spending to support these many new initiatives, the Board voted unanimously to recommend this increase in branch dues. Members voted in March via survey to approve the increase (38 yes and 2 no). This will be effective for July 1, 2020 renewals. We are grateful to everyone who participated in this process.

#### PUBLIC POLICY UPDATE

### **Advocacy Visits to Local PA Representatives**

In 2019, AAUW Carlisle rallied our troops and successfully visited all of our local Pennsylvania Representatives to advocate for equal pay for equal work. This project was planned to coincide with Equal Pay Day and the AAUW PA State Rally at the capitol rotunda. We had such a wonderful experience and turnout for this important advocacy work that the Public Policy Committee is determined to continue this year. We had targeted the month of April for advocacy visits, which would begin with training for our volunteer members prior to meeting with their state reps. Well, in the meantime, we all know what arrived on our doorsteps to make this not possible! The COVID-19 virus restrictions will mean a delay but not an end to our efforts. *Please watch for updates as we will be in touch as soon as new dates can be confirmed.* 

This year we will focus our advocacy on economic security for women in Pennsylvania. There are several good bills pending that we support. Join our advocacy team and we will give you all of the details you need to make the case to your Pennsylvania Representatives!

#### Pay Equity (HB850/SB721)

Pennsylvania saw a one-cent change in the pay gap from 80 cents in 2017 to 81 cents in 2018. The state also moved from 24<sup>th</sup> in the country to 21<sup>st</sup>. Equal Pay Day this year was March 31<sup>st</sup> as compared to April 2<sup>nd</sup> last year. While going in the right direction, narrowing the pay gap by one cent is just not enough!

#### Raising the Minimum Wage (HB1215/SB12)

Every state surrounding Pennsylvania has raised their minimum wage and continues to do so with incremental increases over the next four to five years until reaching the total approved minimum wage. Thereafter, there will be cost of living increases, putting Pennsylvania even further behind.

#### Paid Leave – The Family Care Act (HB1739/SB580)


A priority for AAUW in 2020 is Implementing Paid Leave. The U.S. is the only developed country without paid family and sick leave. We need to adopt policies to give workers paid time off for illness and caregiving.

# Julia Jennings: Feminist: One Women's Pursuit of the Vote

The Cumberland County Historical Society, along with the Carlisle Area League of Women Voters, are joining us in celebration of the 100th Anniversary of Women's Suffrage. Our very own AAUW Carlisle member, Peggy Jennings, will be giving a presentation on her great aunt, Julia Jennings, a prominent suffragist.

Julia served as the Virginia legislative chair for the National Women's Party. Her advocacy for women's suffrage included participating in the now-famous demonstrations at the White House gates, and frequent lobbying efforts with state and national legislators.



Adding a wonderful dimension to the evening, Mr. Wagner from Carlisle High School has invited students to display the projects that they completed for CASD's History Day, with the theme of 'Women Breaking Barriers'. Also, the Carlisle Arts Learning Center (CALC) has invited their artists to create art with that same theme, to be displayed at this event.

While the evening aims to celebrate the 100th anniversary, we also think it is important to show the legacy of suffrage and include other ways women have blazed the trail. This terrific collaboration with CASD and CALC is a wonderful way to do that!
