

From the President

The AAUW fiscal year is winding down, ending on June 30, 2020. And, AAUW Carlisle traditionally takes the summer off – no branch meeting in June or July and the next newsletter is published in August. However, there is still plenty of activity. Membership renewal is in full swing; budgets are being reviewed; the program committee is developing branch meeting programs; public policy is gearing up for election season; preparations are underway for the Yearbook publication; and the Board is developing the strategic plan for FY21.

In mid-June, I will publish the branch annual report via aauwcarlisleinfo@gmail.com to highlight all the accomplishments of this fiscal year. It has been a year of growth and disruption. Eighteen new members joined AAUW Carlisle—the largest single year growth in recent history—bringing total members to 104! See page 3 for AAUW Pennsylvania’s recognition of the achievement. When asked what accounts for our membership growth, I praise our branch members committed to fulfilling the AAUW mission locally.

Since March, the COVID pandemic has disrupted everything we planned and were looking forward to. The May branch meeting, which grew to become a collaboration with other organizations and planned as a public event, is now rescheduled for August 25 (page 2). That is the fourth Tuesday of August, and we would have been gathering for our cherished member potluck and silent auction however that must change (page 2). At the May Board meeting, we discussed potential further impacts and the realization that normal isn’t returning. This disruption is opening the opportunity to learn and create and evolve.

Before closing, I must thank you for being a member of AAUW Carlisle. The Board works hard to make this an organization worthy of your support and involvement. The end of a fiscal year marks Board member transition. Thank you to Mary Brunski, Program Vice President; Carol McAnulty, AAUW Funds Chair; Nancy Sigrist, Public Policy Chair; Jennifer Connell, College/University Liaison; and Darlis Simonton, Bridge Flight Coordinator. More to say about their significant contributions in the upcoming annual report.

Joining the Board are 2020-2022 officers: Linda Brunski, Finance Officer; Gail D’Urso, Membership VP; Judy Wheaton, Program VP; and Public Policy Chair, Katie Perkowski. I am pleased so many appointed Chairs are returning. There are several open Board positions for you to consider (page 6). 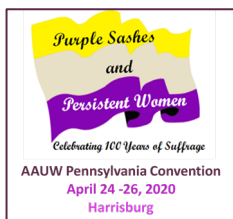

State of AAUW

CEO Kim Churches presents AAUW's annual report in her May 8th "[State of AAUW](#)" presentation. Watch this 30 minute presentation of key organizational updates:

August 26th is the 100th Anniversary of the 19th Amendment

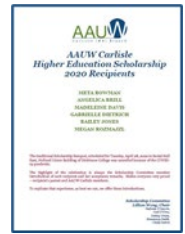
In our local celebration events, it is important we follow AAUW's lead on how to recognize this anniversary.

- AAUW recognizes the struggle to pass the 19th Amendment in 1920, and that it wasn't until 45 years later, when the Voting Rights Act of 1965 was passed that women of color were granted the right to vote.
- Today, there are still challenges with voter access and voting suppression, which is why AAUW will focus on ensuring every vote is recognized in 2020.
- States and branches should acknowledge the importance of the 100th anniversary while also educating members and the public on why the anniversary does not encompass all women's right to vote.
- We have to keep up the fight -- as the country still struggles with voter access and voter suppression.
