A Carlisle Branch Program in Partnership with AAUW Harrisburg: **Carlisle Indian Industrial School Connections**

Barbara Landis, a public historian and Carlisle Indian Industrial School biographer, will present a program about Indian Schools on Wednesday, October 20th at 6 pm at the New Cumberland Public Library Foundation House. She will share



some of the highlights of her experiences traveling with a team from Dickinson College to Native American communities over the past five years. This team has visited with descendants of Indian School students from South Dakota, Montana, Idaho, Arizona, New Mexico, Oklahoma and New York State.

Ms. Landis has also worked with individuals and nations to develop the www.carlisleindianschool.org biographical and research web pages. She urges those who study the Carlisle Indian Industrial School to recognize the complex response from descendants of school students. As a consequence of her work, Landis makes it a point to respectfully honor those students and their descendants who lived the experiment, to celebrate with those who prospered from it, and to grieve with those whose lives were diminished by it.



Topic Walk: The Digital Divide, October 14th & 16th

Lack of access to computers and high-speed internet is creating a digital divide between more affluent, urban students and low income, minority, and rural students. Efforts to address this problem will be discussed, including the expansion of rural broadband in Pennsylvania and a partnership in Philadelphia between business leaders, educators, and nonprofits called PHLConnectD, which is working to get computers into the hands of low-income students and to provide technical assistance to use this tool effectively

Public Policy Updates

Paid Leave: Thank you to AAUW members in the 92nd and 193rd districts who reached out to their representatives currently serving on the committee reviewing the Family Care Act. AAUW Pennsylvania supports this bipartisan piece of legislation that establishes a state-managed insurance fund to provide paid family leave benefits for working Pennsylvanians, without imposing costs on business owners

PA School Funding: AAUW Carlisle passed a resolution supporting the petitioners of the PA School Funding Lawsuit, which addresses Pennsylvania's inadequate school funding system which fuels some of the deepest inequality between school districts in the nation. The trial to prove that our current funding system violates our state constitution's guarantee of a quality public education and equal treatment under the law has been rescheduled to begin November 12, 2021.

GOTV: AAUW hosted a voter registration table at Harvest of the Arts and at Hope Station's Ice Cream Social in September. Thanks to those that volunteered to help register voters, one of the most important activities we do
