New Jersey born and bred, Sandra "Sandy" Gilleo moved from the New Hope, PA area eight years ago, seeking new scenery and new experiences.

In 1997, Sandy retired from a long career teaching students in second to sixth grades. She taught in three schools districts in New Jersey and concluded her career in the New Hope-Solebury, PA school system. Throughout the years, Sandy loved her students and teaching, and after retirement, continued to teach in community settings, including subjects like water aerobics, environmental education and Indian culture.

Sandy is the mother of two grown children, a son who lives in Wisconsin, and a daughter who lives in South Carolina. She is now a kitty mom to two felines, Princess and Blackie. Never one to sit back and do nothing, Sandy volunteers at Hershey Theater, and with the PALS program with Highmark--assisting Highmark clients with services such as rides to medical appointments and grocery shopping. In her leisure time, she enjoys both hand and machine embroidery, and the craft of Irish paper folding. She is also learning the art of quilting.

A former member of the Lower Bucks AAUW branch, Sandy looked at the Carlisle branch website and found the information and activities listed interesting enough that she decided to join. She just attended the Carlisle Industrial Indian School program sponsored jointly by the Harrisburg and Carlisle branches, and says she is impressed with her experiences and the women she has met so far. Sandy wants to be an active member of the branch, saying: "If I see a need and can fill it, I step up."


Pennsylvania Public Policy

News from National Ann Pehle, Past President

2021 marks the 140th anniversary of AAUW, making us one of the oldest feminist-based institutions in the United States.

To mark this momentous occasion, AAUW will be hosting a webinar series featuring some of our most prestigious AAUW fellowships alumnae and a celebration event. The first webinar in the series was October 27th and featured our 1984-85 American Fellow, Dr. Patricia Bell-Scott, an award-winning author and professor emerita of women's studies and human development and family science at the University of Georgia. Her most recent book, <u>The Firebrand and The First Lady</u>, tells the story of how a



brilliant writer-turned-activist, who was the granddaughter of a mulatto slave, and the first lady of the United States, whose ancestry gave her membership in the Daughters of the American Revolution, forged an enduring friendship that changed each of their lives, enriched the conversation about race, and added vital fuel to the movement for human rights in America.



Hope you didn't miss the announcement of Gloria Blackwell as AAUW's CEO effective October 18, 2021. After 17 years at AAUW, <u>Gloria L. Blackwell</u> took on a new role: CEO. "I am incredibly honored and grateful to the Board for valuing my commitment to global gender equity, my leadership at AAUW and the contributions of my high-performing teams," said Blackwell.

Among her <u>many accomplishments</u> is her longtime management of AAUW's fellowships and grants program, which awarded more than \$70 million to women scholars and programs in the U.S. and overseas. Blackwell was also the driving force behind AAUW's signature programs, including its salary negotiation trainings, which have reached nearly 190,000 people.

"As AAUW proudly celebrates 140 years of advancing equity for women and girls this year, we know that Gloria is the right leader at the right time," said Board Chair Julia Brown.

The Rev. Carla Christopher Wilson, Assistant to the Bishop of the Lower Susquehanna Synod and Associate Pastor at the Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd in Lancaster, PA.



Carla Christopher Wilson is a cultural competency and diversity trainer specializing in Racial Justice and LGBTQIA+ inclusion, survivor empowerment, and trauma-informed care. She is also a renewal pastor with the ELCA Lutheran Church, currently serving as Assistant to the Bishop of Lower Susquehanna Synod in Charge of Justice Ministries where she coordinates mission and outreach in the areas of Racial Justice, LGBTQIA+ Affirmation, Immigration, Disability Inclusion, and Hunger/Housing Advocacy for the southcentral Pennsylvania region.

A former Poet Laureate of York (2011 – 2013), the co-founder of York Equality Fest which became York County Pride, and an award winning and multiple-published writer, Carla has

twice received the key to York City for her community empowerment initiatives. She currently serves on the Pennsylvania Commission for LGBTQ Affairs and is a member of the Statewide Policy Council for Lutheran Advocacy Ministries in Pa (LAMPa). She also writes regularly for ELCA World Hunger, Sparkhouse, Sundays and Seasons, Extraordinary Lutheran Ministries, and Disrupt Worship Project.

Carla studied psychology, education, and creative writing at Columbia University in the City of New York and spent years as an educator and case manager in domestic violence shelters, state prison systems, and school districts before receiving her Master of Divinity from United Lutheran Seminary in 2019. She has been the force behind regional campaigns and activism training curriculum for groups like Food and Water Watch, Put People First – PA, the Y.W.C.A. of York County, the United Way of Franklin and York Counties, and several political campaigns. She has also traveled around the globe, from Rutgers and Penn State to organizations in Kosovo, Albania, Flint, Chicago, Baltimore, Phoenix and Philadelphia, as a speaker and trainer.

Jessi Purdy, Founder and CEO of FIC Human Resource Partners



Jessica Purdy's desire for a more inclusive and accepting society led her to become an Activist, Public Speaker, and Founder of FIC Human Resource Partners, LLC.

Her identity as a panromantic, asexual, transwoman is central to her life and work. She is, as they say, Out and Proud. But rather than 'coming out', she brings people into her confidence, her truth, and her life. It's a combination of her personal experiences and mindset of 'bringing people in' that has made her an effective leader, facilitator, and change agent.

The 'new collar' journey that led to her founding FIC Human Resource Partners began with

Military Service as a Legal Specialist. Her nearly 4 years of service ended with an honorable discharge under Don't Ask, Don't Tell. Once she transitioned back into the civilian workforce, she moved up from an hourly wage Service Technician position through Service, Branch, and Regional Manager positions before becoming the Director of Culture and Talent for the C3 Agency. At each step in her journey, she gained new knowledge and experience that helped her develop the skills and tools that she is now offering to organizations such as ours.

Topic Walk - The Digital Divide

We had beautiful weather for our October Topic Walk on The Digital Divide at Thornwald Park. We were joined by Theresa Rice, the new director of the Professional Empowerment and Educational Center which operates under the umbrella of Hope Station and the YWCA, with assistance from Dickinson College. Theresa had a career as a teacher before she took some time off to be a military spouse and mom. With her youngest son heading to high school, she decided to get back into substitute teaching, and quickly learned that technology has totally changed how subjects are learned and taught in our schools. She was interested in the work at PEEC because she had experienced something of a digital divide in terms of her own career. So here are a few takeaways from our conversation on The Digital Divide:

- 1. It's definitely not just a socio economic issue, but also a generational issue.
- 2. It has an impact across the political spectrum the lack of internet access and digital education affects both rural areas and urban areas
- 3. The current rate of technological advances demands a deliberative life-long learning approach. This is particularly important to address for women who step out of the workforce for caregiving and might find themselves behind when they return to their careers.

Theresa spoke with our group about how the center works to bridge the digital divide in Carlisle and invited interested AAUW members to volunteer at PEEC helping to sign in guests using computers and assisting them as necessary.
