
Donations will be accepted at this event for the YWCA Pad Pantry which supports CASD school nurses' pad




On August 26th, Women's Equality Day commemorates the passage of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution in 1920, thereby granting women the right to vote.

Disruption as Opportunity... It's a Woman's World

Fun to see so many Carlisle members attend the AAUW Pennsylvania convention in Harrisburg June 3-5. Go here for summary of events, links to presentations, link to photos, and more.

FY23 started on July 1, 2022 and that means a new Board is constituted. Cindy Hall (State College) succeeds Ann Pehle (Carlisle) as AAUW President. Ann remains on the AAUW Pennsylvania Board for this fiscal year, just the first term of the new President. News from National AAUW Update

There is a lot of AAUW news to catch up on since the May newsletter.

- AAUW's stand on reproductive health and Title IX are covered on the AAUW Pennsylvania website.
- The Student Debt Crisis was addressed in a May 3rd webinar that explored the realities and possible misconceptions about student debt. Women hold around two-thirds of the country's \$1.7 trillion of student debt, according to AAUW's report, <u>Deeper in Debt: Women and Student Loans</u>. Because of the gender pay gap, they have less income with which to repay their loans. Student debt erodes economic security and is particularly burdensome for women of color. The panelists discussed their research and efforts to help borrowers and halt abuses by the student loan industry.
- In April, AAUW announced that over \$6 million in funding to more than 320 fellows and grantees in the 2022-23 award year. Go here to learn more about the program and see a reading list of publications authored by the recipients. The names of these exceptional recipients, who will pursue academic work and lead innovative community projects to empower women and girls, were released on July 1. Searching the directory is relatively easy and when searching on Pennsylvania, you will find 15 recipients—one from Dickinson College.

- The (Virtual) National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL) was held on May 24-26, 2022. Sofia Perrone, of Dickinson College and President of AAUW Dickinson Student Organization received a grant from AAUW Pennsylvania to attend.
