


Fix Harrisburg: The Necessity for Legislative Rules Reform

Why does it seem that so many issues that are important to and would benefit the citizens of Pennsylvania are not addressed in our state legislature? The answer: Legislative Rules. At our **September 27 meeting** at the **Dickinson College HUB** Jean Handley from Fair Districts PA will explore how the legislative rules obstruct legislation and bi-partisan collaboration. We will also look at the Constitutional Amendment process and how it can be manipulated by the majority party and circumvent the Executive Branch of our government to achieve their desired policies. Jean will then talk about ways to advocate for change. Jean has been involved with Fair Districts since 2017 and has been the Dauphin County Coordinator since April 2017. Fair Districts is a non-partition statewide coalition with a mission to ensure a fair and transparent redistricting process in Pennsylvania.

The culmination of three years of work will take place at the Capitol on Sept. 21.

From the start, our goal was not just to talk about women's economic security issues, but to bring about real change. To that end, we will be presenting a white paper to our legislators and community.

The white paper, researched and written by Nancy Sigrist, Cherry France, and Kate Elkins, is intended to provide insights into the topics and issues that were discussed at Beyond Suffrage. We are hopeful it will become a resource for those in a position to make a difference in the lives of Pennsylvania women, as well as for our citizens and advocates so that they can better understand the importance of economic opportunity and equity, some of the issues that are currently roadblocks for women and some of the things that are important to

consider in order to move the financial security of women forward.

All in all, AAUW PA raised \$1100 for the Greatest Need Fund and the Carlisle Branch gift basket brought in an admirable chunk of that total!

The Carlisle Branch was well represented by the number of attendees at the Convention. Just after the State Convention, the Board met for our annual Planning Meeting in preparation for our 2022-2023 programming year. At that meeting, the Board passed the following Motions by unanimous consent:

- Motion to approve an additional \$45 to cover the full State Convention registration rate
- Motion to approve participation in the Penn State Dickinson School of Law and Dickinson College Reproductive Justice event scheduled for September 12 (page 6)
- Motion to budget \$600 for the August Social to pay for pre-packaged meals
- Motion to cover the \$112.58 cost of a canopy to be used for AAUW outdoor events

While we did our best to take care of all outstanding Branch business prior to our summer break, we nevertheless found ourselves Zooming for Special Board Meetings in July and August to vote on Motions in need of a timely response. Over the summer, the following Motions were passed by unanimous consent:

- Motion to promote Branch membership at the Carlisle Barracks Spouses' Club Super Sign-Up event on August 24th
- Motion to partner with a number of community organizations in voter registration events and cover our registration costs during the 2022-2023 programming year
- Motion to pledge \$500 from a restricted, anonymous donation "for public policy or other programming" to the funding of the Reproductive Justice event to be held on September 12th

- Sue J. Frietsche, a senior staff attorney and founder and director of the Women's Law Project's Western Pennsylvania office, who discussed a case before the Pennsylvania Supreme Court in which she represents abortion providers challenging the state's ban on Medicaid funds covering abortion.
- Dr. Sarah Horvath, Medical Director, Planned Parenthood Keystone spoke about the medical issues of abortion legislation.

Cultural Opportunity with AAUW Harrisburg

AAUW Harrisburg has once again extended an invitation to our members to join them on a cultural trip to Washington, D.C. and the National Gallery of Art to see the upcoming "Sargent and Spain" exhibit on **Sunday, November 13**. This exhibit will feature approximately 120 dazzling oils, watercolors, and drawings, many of which are rarely shown publicly.



Sargent was celebrated as *the* leading society portraitist of his era and he influenced a generation of American painters. His personal captivation with Spain resulted in a remarkable body of work over three decades that documents his extensive travels throughout the region. Sargent responded to the country's rich culture by producing landscapes and marine sciences, pictures of everyday life, architectural students and sympathetic portrayals of the locals he encountered.

Kimberly Mutcherson Co-Dean and Professor of Law, Rutgers Law School

Dean Mutcherson is an award-winning professor whose scholarship focuses on reproductive justice, bioethics, and family and health law. She has presented her scholarship nationally and internationally and publishes extensively on assisted reproduction, families, and the law. She was a visiting scholar at the University of Pennsylvania Center for Bioethics and the Columbia Law School Center for Gender and Sexuality Law.

Melissa Murray
Frederick I. and Grace Stokes Professor of Law, New York University (NYU)
Law

Professor Murray teaches constitutional law, family law, criminal law, and reproductive rights and justice at NYU Law. Her research focuses on the legal regulation of sex and sexuality and encompasses such topics as marriage and its alternatives, the marriage equality debate, the legal recognition of caregiving, and reproductive rights and justice.
