Women's Economic Issues Spotlighted in Beyond Suffrage White Paper & Equity Quilt Presentation

AAUW Carlisle, along with our partners and friends, presented our women's economic security white paper to Rep. Patty Kim and the General Assembly on Sept. 21 in the Capitol Rotunda. This was the culmination of a three year effort which began with our *Beyond Suffrage: Reclaiming the Future* women's forum and a commitment to move the needle on removing barriers to women being able to compete in the job market on an equal playing field.

Our white paper looks at how the lack of adequate child care and eldercare support, paid family leave, the gender wage gap, and the lack of a living wage impacts women disproportionately, identifies the causes, and calls on the General Assembly to address these roadblocks to equality.

The paper is thoroughly researched and relatable and we hope it will be a resource for those in a position to make a difference in the lives of Pennsylvania women. (See **Beyond Suffrage** on page 3)

Dean Danielle Conway to Speak at October 25th Meeting



Danielle Conway, Dean of Penn State Dickinson Law, will discuss her distinguished career, including successes achieved and challenges encountered as a leader, lawyer, military officer, parent, community member and a Black woman. Dean Conway will also discuss the establishment of (1) the Macon Bolling Allen Civil Rights and Transitional Justice Program at Dickinson Law; and (2) the Antiracist Development Institute (ADI) at Dickinson Law.

Danielle Conway was born in Pennsylvania, earned a BS at NYU, a JD at Howard University School of Law, and an LLM at George Washington University Law School. Dean Conway has served as the Dean and Donald J. Farage Professor of Law at Penn State Dickinson Law since 2019. She previously served as Dean at the University of Maine School of Law and the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, William S. Richardson School of Law, and is the author of numerous books and publications on many aspects of law and

society. She has over twenty-seven years of service in the U.S. Army and retired in the rank of lieutenant colonel. From the President

I am delighted to announce that our Board has a new Vice President - Mary Brunski! Mary kindly accepted my invitation to fill the vacancy in this position, which was newly created by our recently revised Bylaws, approved by Branch Members in March of this year. The Executive Committee unanimously and enthusiastically supported this appointment. Her term as Vice President will end on June 30, 2024. Welcome - and thank you - Mary!

There is also notable member news from our youngest member, Samantha Martin who is studying at Gettysburg College where she is trying to establish an AAUW Student Organization (SO). Although AAUW is "no longer supporting Student Organizations" according to AAUW PA College Liaison Barbara Johnstone, AAUW PA President Cindy Hall is looking into how they might incorporate Pennsylvania SOs into their State organizational structure. While the decision at the national level is disappointing, I was pleased to see strong support expressed for our SOs amongst our State Board members and fellow Branch Presidents at a recent State President's Zoom Meeting. I believe our college student members are the future of AAUW and supporting them in their efforts to work for gender equity is our best way to ensure the work that we've committed ourselves to in the Branch today continues far into the future after us.

And speaking of students, our Branch recently received a lovely thank you note from Trailblazer and recent high school graduate Cheney Thompson. We also received a note of thanks from the YWCA of Carlisle and Cumberland County for the large donation of feminine hygiene products collected at the August Social for CASD girls.

Other Branch business to report is that our Board met in September for the first time in FY 2022/23 and unanimously approved amendments to our Budget which we then submitted to the Branch for final approval at our September Branch Meeting. Other motions approved by the majority of the Board were:

- To reinstate the Kaffee Klatsch to raise money for the 100th Anniversary Celebration;
- To continue the volunteer relationship for the academic year 2022-23 with regional school districts for STEM/Engineering and financial literacy activities by partnering with regional schools and Junior Achievement; and
- To approve funding [\$525] to contract with the internal assessment facilitator, as proposed by the DEIB Committee [for two, hour long small group discussions with Branch leadership, providing Branch leadership with resources and reading materials, to conduct a Branch-wide survey of members, and create a plan incorporating the results from the surveys for Best Practices to reach and engage diverse members of our community, in summary].

The Board also discussed various Community Activity proposals with the hope of finding a good balance between time commitment required by participants and cost to attract an array of members to these events. Branch Members are encouraged to submit suggestions for Community Activities to Chair Cindy Sutton.

Finally, I reminded the Board that we will need to convene a Nominating Committee in November. While the Chair of the Committee must be a volunteer from the Board, the two other members of the Committee may come from the Branch. These members will assist the Chair to find candidates for open elected positions to propose to the Board. This year, the Nominating Committee will seek candidates for President, Secretary, Program Co-Vice President, two Membership Co-Vice Presidents and a Finance Co-Officer for terms beginning June 30, 2023 and ending June 30, 2025. Anyone interested in serving on this Committee - or having questions about any of the upcoming open positions on the Board - please see me!

What's Up in Pennsylvania? News from AAUW Pennsylvania

AAUW Pennsylvania offers a Mission-Critical Program series, via Zoom webinars/meetings, covering AAUW mission issues where our advocacy can make a difference in Pennsylvania and/or federally. If you missed the first two or wish to view them again, go to https://aauw-pa.aauw.net/aauw-pa-webinars/.

The first webinar was August 25, 2022 entitled *Pennsylvania Reproductive Rights after Dobbs*. The speakers were:

- Sue J. Frietsche, a senior staff attorney and founder and director of the Women's Law Project's Western Pennsylvania office, who discussed a case before the Pennsylvania Supreme Court in which she represents abortion providers challenging the state's ban on Medicaid funds covering abortion.
- Dr. Sarah Horvath, Medical Director, Planned Parenthood Keystone spoke about the medical issues of abortion legislation.

The second meeting was September 29, 2022 with the AAUW Pennsylvania Public Policy team presenting *Where Do Your State Legislators Stand on AAUW Issues?* A deeper look at incumbent and candidate voting records or views on the Pennsylvania Constitutional Amendment legislation. The third webinar is scheduled for October 25, 2022 at 7:00pm, **News Savvy**, features Guest speaker Chris Baxter, Executive Director & Editor in Chief of Spotlight PA — the largest newsroom in Pennsylvania dedicated to holding the Pennsylvania state government to account. The Spotlight PA team of a dozen investigative reporters and editors based in the capital are working every day to keep track of taxpayer dollars and ensure the government is working for the people — and no one else.

President Biden's announcement to forgive some debt for federal student loan recipients is welcome news addressing a core gender and racial equity issue.

Pregnant Workers Fairness Act (PWFA) passed the House of Representatives in a bipartisan 315-101 vote. Despite overwhelming support, this critical piece of legislation continues to stall in the U.S. Senate. Pennsylvania Senator Casey is one of the original co-sponsors of the legislation. Constitution Day Delved into Dobbs Ruling

Penn State Dickinson Law, Dickinson College and the Department of Women's, Gender & Sexuality Studies, the AAUW-Carlisle (PA) branch, and the YWCA Carlisle & Cumberland County co-sponsored "<u>Constitution Day: Reproductive Justice</u> in the Wake of the Supreme Court's Decision to Overturn Roe v. Wade". The September 12 event brought two well

know legal scholars to Carlisle to discuss the implications of Dobbs and the legal crossroads ahead. It included a "Lunch & Learn" held at Dickinson College, featuring Rutgers Law School Co-Dean and Professor of Law, Kimberly Mutcherson and Melissa Murray, the Frederick I. and Grace Stokes Professor of Law at New York University Law. Later in the day at Dickinson Law, Mutcherson and Murray participated in a keynote panel moderated by Dr. Mireille Rebeiz, associate professor of women's, gender, and sexuality studies and francophone studies at Dickinson College.
