# **Board Launches New Scholarship Donation Option**

The AAUW Carlisle board is addressing the need to provide branch members with an alternative to checks when making donations and paying for branch events and activities. A pilot payment process using the existing PayPal account will be launched in conjunction with the annual appeal for donations to the branch Higher Education Scholarship fund. *A PayPal donation button is now available on the branch website!* 

**Instructions**: On the home page, look for the <u>Higher Education Scholarship</u> tab at the top of the page. Open the tab to see the *PayPal Donate* button on that page. Click the button to open the PayPal payment screen. PayPal donations may be made using a personal PayPal account, credit or debit card.

Be aware that there is a transaction fee for using PayPal which will be deducted from the donation to the Scholarship fund. This is standard for the payee's convenience of using a third party to accept money for a payment or purchase.

The board would like to extend the PayPal option at a later date to pay for the Scholarship Banquet. After these two on-line payment opportunities are used, the board will make an assessment about whether to extend use of PayPal for payments for additional branch events such as the Holiday Brunch and August Social.

#### Bias of AI (Artificial Intelligence) in Hiring

January 11, 2023 featured Lori Andrews a Distinguished Professor of Law at Illinois Institute of Technology Chicago-Kent College of Law and Director of IIT's Institute for Science, Law and Technology. She was an adviser on technologies to Congress, WHO, NIH, CDC, and multiple other agencies. She chaired the federal ethics advisory committee to the Human Genome Project. Andrews authored eleven nonfiction books and three mysteries. She has been interviewed extensively including CBS Morning News, The Today Show, Nightline, 60 Minutes, PBS NewsHour, and Oprah. Professor Andrews' path-breaking litigation about technologies caused the National Law Journal to list her as one of the "100 Most Influential Lawyers in America." # WOMEN TOGETHER – FIGHTING ON THE FRONT LINE

July 2023 marks the 160<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Battle of Gettysburg where townswomen showed their mettle by nursing the wounded, turning churches and schools into makeshift hospitals, and some even fought as soldiers on the battlefield. Today AAUW Women are continuing to fight together on the Front Line for pay equity, women's comprehensive healthcare, legislative representation, Title IX education equity, fair voting practices, and legislating against abuse, violence, and persistent gender, gender-identity, and racial biases. Our theme focuses on how AAUW-PA's Strategic Plan involves "Women Together" actively "Fighting on the Front Line" for women's equity today.

Our retreat will begin in Pennsylvania Hall (which was a Civil War hospital) and continues with a full program, luncheon and guest speakers on Saturday July 29. Options for pre-retreat excursions are planned for Friday evening as well as historical post-retreat excursion options.

# News from National AAUW Update

The Pregnant Workers Fairness Act, FINALLY passed as an amendment to the omnibus spending package. President Biden signed this critical bill into law on December 29, 2022. Read Gloria Blackwell's statement <a href="here">here</a>. AAUW advocated on this issue from the very beginning. Every member who responded to Two Minute Activist's requests to share your support made this happen.

Effective June 27, 2023, employers will be required to provide basic accommodations to pregnant workers, such as carrying a water bottle or taking bathroom breaks. The legislation will enable millions of workers to provide for their families without compromising their health or pregnancies. This is the most significant protection for pregnant workers in decades! Learn more about the law from AAUW partners at A Better Balance.

#### **New Pay-Gap Analysis Highlights Disturbing Trends**

In December, AAUW published the <u>most recent update</u> to the Simple Truth, our signature report on the gender pay gap. The analysis shed light on the devastating effect of the pandemic on women's economic security. It found that, in 2021, all women workers (including those in full- and part-time roles) took home only 77 cents for every dollar all men workers did. In addition, more women than men worked part-time (59% vs 41%), positions that earn less per hour and have reduced access to family-friendly benefits like paid leave.





# AAUW Partners on National Science Foundation Grant: Let's Talk Money

Building on AAUW's strong pay equity and salary-negotiation research and programs, AAUW has a five-year partnership with the Rochester Institute of Technology and Aspire/The Association of Public and Land Grant Universities (APLU). practices for faculty compensation to a broad community in higher education.

# The DEIB Committee: Progress Made and What's Coming Next

As a national organization, AAUW has adopted a bold strategic plan which includes promoting inclusion and awareness in order to create an equitable, sustainable, and inclusive membership reflective of today's world. This means members becoming more comfortable sharing their perspectives outside of diversity trainings and to address diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) in all aspects of their work and lives. The initiative seeks to encourage ongoing dialogue that will inspire all members to bring these values to their personal and professional interactions.

In January of 2021, our Branch leadership created the Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging Committee to help our branch turn the AAUW National DEI framework into actionable goals and strategies, and to help our members understand how it factors into every decision made in the branch and ultimately, in our member's lives.

The three core components of the DEIB Committee efforts include:

- conducting a comprehensive audit of the branch, including our governance, policies, and procedures, the
  membership's experience and understanding of DEIB, and our external partner's view of our DEIB efforts in the
  community,
- developing a program to educate and inform the membership on a variety of DEIB topics while conducting, and
- being a resource to all committees, leaders, and members as they discover ways to incorporate DEIB into their programs and events.

To meet these objectives, the Carlisle Branch of AAUW has performed a variety of activities to assess the current state of our organizational inclusiveness and measure the membership's interest in the topic. This included conducting an external survey of community partners as well as hosting a pilot program, called Listening Circles, in the fall of 2021. The purpose of this program was to gauge the interest of our membership in DEIB topics. The program included four virtual events on racism, ageism, ableism, and gender/LGBTQ+ discrimination and was attended by more than 40 participants.

Data from the community partner survey indicated that we have work to do internally as well as externally if we are to intentionally adopt DEIB as a core value of our Branch work and relationships. In order to more fully digest the data collected and consider the subsequent recommendations of the survey, a special meeting of the Board of Directors, which also included other Branch Leaders, was held in March 2022.

At the conclusion of the meeting, it became clear that the leadership needs further discovery and discussion regarding the Branch's perceived and actual organizational inclusiveness. And while there are resources available on the national AAUW website that may be helpful in that effort, the DEIB Committee approached the board to consider hiring a professional facilitator, so that all leaders, including our DEIB Committee members, can participate fully and without reservation.

At its November 2022 Board meeting, the leadership of AAUW Carlisle voted to conduct an internal assessment and hired the Rev. Carla Christopher (she/her), a local DEIB leader with a deep bench in facilitating conversations with organizations like ours. Carla who was also a panelist at one of our Listening Circles pilot programs, will facilitate small group discussions with the board and other leaders in the Branch (10:00 am on February 11 at the YWCA) as well as help to facilitate a branch-wide survey of all members, to better understand our interest, capacity, and experience working in DEIB concepts. Lastly, she will work with the DEIB Committee to create an action plan for the entire branch, based on the outcomes of the external and internal assessments.

Carla Christopher (she/her/hers) is a poet-activist, cultural competency trainer, and ordained redevelopment/congregational vitality pastor in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) — one of the first out LGBTQ Black women ordained in her denomination. Carla was the 4th Poet Laureate of York, PA and has toured the globe as a performer, repeatedly published and award-winning author, public speaker, and workshop facilitator / trainer. She specializes in areas of creative writing and storytelling, community-based advocacy and activism, trauma-informed care and mindfulness, diversity, and cultural competency.



Carla currently serves as Assistant to the Bishop in Charge of Justice Ministries, Lower Susquehanna Synod (south central PA region) and on the pastoral teams for the digital ministry, Release Faith, and Heidelberg United Church of Christ in York, PA. She also writes regularly for Disrupt Worship, ELCA World Hunger, Sparkhouse, Sundays and Seasons and others.

When not preaching and teaching, Carla is a commissioner on the Pennsylvania Commission for LGBTQ Affairs and the York City Human Relations Commission,

moonlights with the poetry-funk fusion band, Groove Ink, and shamelessly spoils her dog.
