Other motions of note approved at the March Board Meeting:

- To co-sponsor a fall Clarke Forum lecture about women's reproductive health by Dr. Sarah Hill (<u>https://www.sarahehill.com/</u>) with the Dickinson AAUW Student Organization;
- To fund the Summer Retreat registration fees for the President and Vice President;
- To move investment funds from matured certificates of deposit and savings account into higher interest-yielding CDs;
- To waive Branch dues for Shape the Future new member applications;
- To send a questionnaire to Carlisle School Board candidates and post responses on our website ahead of the May primary;
- To conduct a public, in person Carlisle School Board candidate forum ahead of the November general election; and
- To award four Higher Education Scholarships.

At the state level, please remember to vote in the AAUW PA election by April 30th (<u>http://www.surveymonkey.com/r/2023AAUWElection</u>). The results of this election will be certified at the state Annual Meeting by Zoom on May 9th at 7 pm, so mark your calendars and keep your eyes peeled for the link to the meeting.

## Holly Heroines, Stories Seldom Told

The Mt. Holly Springs Sesquicentennial celebration will present a theatrical pageant with an historical foundation called "Holly Heroines, Stories Seldom Told." The one night only performance will be on April 15th at 7:00 PM at the Mt. Holly Church of God at 602 McLand Rd. in Mt. Holly Springs.



This ticketed event, which is also a fundraiser for the Amelia Givin Library, features many remarkable women throughout the history of Mt. Holly Springs, from the 1700s through modern times. One of those women was Miss Emelyn Trine.

Miss Trine was a Carlisle High School English teacher who transformed many young lives throughout her teaching career in the 1940s and 1960s. She was also a member of the American Association of University Women Carlisle Branch during this time and, in 1949, was editor of our first newsletter!

Miss Trine's lifespan intersected with that of Amelia Givin's and some suspect that she played a role in the Mount Holly Springs farm girl going to Dickinson College, and then Columbia University, and led to her career as an English teacher.

Tickets for the 7 pm performance are available for purchase at the Amelia Givin Library for \$10. Tickets for the 5:30 pm pre-show hors d'oeuvres are \$25. A number of AAUW members have already said they plan to attend the performance. Will you join us?

## **Civics 9-1-1 Raises Community Awareness**

The Public Policy Committee's non-partisan civics engagement series, *Civics 9-1-1*, is well underway. In the first two of this three part series, we explored our constitutional foundations and long-held democratic norms, discussed how to separate facts from disinformation and how to have a civil conversation. Part three will address the election system and discuss how citizens can become engaged in local community and civic activities.

Session I, **"American Democracy: What We Believe"**, was held on March 21<sup>st</sup> with over 35 people in attendance. AAUW Carlisle members, Dr. Marybeth Ulrich, Professor of Government at the U.S. Army War College and Judge Mary (Cherry) France (retired), U.S. Bankruptcy Court, Middle District, PA, discussed our *Constitutional Foundations and Principles of Democracy*. The audience also learned about citizen obligations that, when followed, will serve to promote a healthy and sustainable democracy.

Session II on March 30<sup>th</sup>, entitled **"Fact or Fiction: Disinformation & Civil Discourse"**, featured Cumberland County Commissioners Jean Foschi and Vince DiFilippo who discussed the importance of finding common ground, providing examples of how they work across the political isle to further the people's business, and Chris Baxter, Founder and Executive Director, Spotlight PA, who discussed how to identify disinformation and the effect of social media. Kate Elkins moderated and guided attendees through 9 tips for effectively exchanging ideas with those who have opposing opinions and different values.
