Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala is the Director General of the World Trade Organization, the first woman and first African to hold the position.

Thoughts from a Member of the Board

I am about to complete my fifth year on the Board of AAUW Carlisle and thought that this would be a good time to share some of my thoughts.

I joined AAUW in 2015 and I didn't know a soul. At that time, Linkey Green was Branch President. She warmly welcomed me into the branch and it didn't take too long before I joined the Membership Committee under the leadership of Carolyn Freberg and Sue Royer. In 2017, I was asked if I would consider becoming a Membership Co-Vice President. I had just retired and decided that I would have time fill the role that Carolyn was about to exit. My



responsibilities were clearly defined in my "Job Description" as were the responsibilities of our Co VP, Sue Royer. Sue and I did much of our work via email or telephone or on our computers. We actually had quite a few laughs and shared the work fairly. Membership responsibilities didn't consume more than an hour or two of my time most weeks.

When Sue's term expired, Virginia Mauk joined me as Co VP. We worked well together and membership continued to increase. I agreed to stay on for a second term. Much of the next two years were dominated by Covid-19 and Virginia and I did some fancy footwork to maintain membership through challenging times. After many meetings on Zoom, when we were able to resume in-person meetings, we followed public health protocols in order to assure members that we were doing what we could to minimize risk. Two of our most recent August Socials were catered so that there was no sharing of food. Social distancing was practiced in table set ups. Masks were available at monthly meetings. And we didn't lose many members. When my term expired, the nomination committee was unable to find a replacement. So, Virginia did a whole year of Membership by herself. Thankfully, Cindy Sutton is joining her for the next year.

In 2022 - 23, I was asked to serve as a Program Co VP. I had the pleasure of working with Co-VP Janet Kacsur and a Committee of dedicated, hardworking members. We planned a dynamic 2022 -23 Program Year as our country moved toward a post-Covid normalcy. Again, the work load was fairly divided. We communicated frequently so we wouldn't overlook anything our speakers or members needed. This next year, Deb Sweeney has stepped into Janet's role as Program Co VP and the Program Committee is already well on the way to planning a dynamic schedule of meetings to reflect our 100th Anniversary.

So, why am I telling you all of this? Well, I think that, sometimes, people are reluctant to take on Board responsibilities because they think it will be an overwhelming amount of work. I'm here to tell you that it isn't! I admit that I am a pretty organized person. I make lists and schedules. And I meet deadlines and honor commitments. There are some busy times for both Membership and Programs but I had been given enough information to know when those busy times would occur. And I planned for that. The payback for this work for me is that I have gotten to know so many of our members better than I would have if I hadn't taken on these roles. And when I have needed help, these members have been supportive, encouraging, and they have stepped right up to help. (See Trailblazers 2022 when I got pneumonia!!!). So, what I am suggesting is that you consider taking on a Board position in the future. I think you'll be glad you did!

On Monday, June 19th, 167 elementary-aged students will start their SPY summer camp experience and enjoy an unforgettable 6-weeks of academic enrichment and personal growth. For 91 percent of these children, who live in economically-disadvantaged households, this is the opportunity of a lifetime. Because of SPY, they are given access to the same educationally supportive resources their more affluent peers benefit from, that they otherwise would not be able to afford. Resources, and relationships, that could transform their future.

For the mothers of these students, SPY means so much more. SPY's free program is affordable childcare during the summer months, keeping their children safe and nourished so they can continue to work and provide for their families. SPY is a supportive partner as they face a myriad of mothering challenges, so they don't have to feel that they are alone.

Last summer 150 students were enrolled. As you can see, once again SPY has grown. Elementary School Counselors continue to recognize an increased number of students who are in need of a program like SPY. And though enrollment for this summer is full, referrals keep coming in. I think you will agree, this is a critical need!

Community support makes SPY possible. We are looking for volunteers, 15 every day, to help prepare, deliver and serve food.
