Utilizing Agriculture Education to Enhance the Lives of Ugandan Girls Tuesday, March 26, 7:00 pm

Rebecca Whigham, Family & Consumer Science teacher Big Spring Middle School



What's for dinner? This frequently asked question could have multiple responses for those of us with a variety of options. Not so, however, for many who find the security of available healthy food to be a challenge. Rebecca Whigham teaches her students about food sustainability and consumption of products with consideration for others.

Through this work she was chosen as a World Food Prize Global Guide and subsequently, she was selected to join ten other United States educators as a part of the US Department of Education Fulbright-Hays program.

These educators traveled to Uganda this summer and spent a month collaborating on a food security project at the all-girl St. Katherine's School. Becky will share her experience and the role of home economics in global food security. You won't want to miss it!

Becky is a graduate of Kenyon College with degrees in Sociology and American Studies. She also studied at the Australian National Outdoor Leadership School and has a teaching certificate from Wilson College. Prior to her current position her work included ten years at the Diakon Wilderness Center in the outdoor challenge program, long term substitute



teaching in public schools and time at home with her children. Becky and her husband are parents of a 12 year old daughter and an 8 year old son.

When Confederate General J.E.B. Stuart demanded the surrender of Federal troops in Carlisle on July 1, 1863, Union General William Smith replied, "Shell and be damned!" You'll be relieved the shells aren't still flying as we visit the restored courtroom of Cumberland County's 1846 Old Courthouse and (if you wish!) climb up to enjoy the view from the bell tower.

A short walk south lies the Old Public Graveyard, where "Heroine of Monmouth" Molly Pitcher (Mary Hays McCauley), Pennsylvania Impressionist Esther Groom, and other noted Carlisle residents lie beneath a picturesque collection of cemetery art and monuments. History, art, and eternal rest!

This term, positions up for election are: President, Program Vice President, and Marketing & Communication Vice President. All the votes will be announced and ratified at the affiliate's annual meeting on May 4.

AAUW is proposing a Bylaw change to eliminate the degree requirement for membership. This is referred to as "open membership."

Voting will take place **April 3-May 15**. Most members will receive emails from **vote@simplyvoting.com** with their unique Elector ID and Password to vote. All members without an email address on file or who have unsubscribed from AAUW national emails will receive a paper ballot by mail. No additional paper ballots will be sent during the voting period.
