I remain confident that all of us will continue to represent the mission of the organization that we had hoped the vote would reflect. It is a real comfort to do this work with all of you incredible women! Hold your heads high. The fight continues!

On Monday, June 24, 165 at-risk elementary-aged students in the Carlisle and South Middleton School Districts will start their SPY summer camp experience. This summer, there will also be a new SPY location in Newville, so starting on July 8, 25 Big Spring 1st and 2nd graders will be the first SPY Big Spring campers! Monday-Friday, from 8am-3:15pm, for 6-weeks, campers will engage in activities designed to promote academic achievement and foster personal growth. Over 95% of SPY campers come from low-income homes. SPY's free camp gives these under-resourced children an equal opportunity for a thriving future!

For the hard-working mothers of our campers, SPY means so much more. SPY's free program is affordable childcare during the summer months, keeping their children safe and nourished so they can continue to work and provide for their families. SPY is a supportive partner for single, working mothers as they face a myriad of challenges.

Community support is the only way SPY is possible. They are looking for volunteers, at least 15 every day, to help prepare, deliver, and serve food. Donations of classroom items are also needed to help ensure enough supplies to effectively enrich the lives of deserving children.


