Tis the Season



Begin the holiday season this year by attending the Holiday Brunch and be entertained with seasonal music by select singers from Cantate Carlisle. An auditioned adult choir of 40-50 members, Cantate typically performs two concerts per year while also enjoying community collaborations with the West Shore Symphony Orchestra and Dickinson College. Cantate has also assisted with choir camp activities at the Summer Program for Youth (SPY) and hosted an intern through the Carlisle Chamber of Commerce. The organization has expanded to include a youth choir and a children's choir.

Cantate is led by artistic director Michelle Trefren, who has been a church musician since middle school. A graduate of Syracuse University with a degree in piano performance and Westminster Choir College with a degree in conducting, Michelle has taught music at Yokohama International Music School and directed the Tokyo International Children's Choir. She currently serves as music director at Second Presbyterian Church and teaches private piano and voice lessons.

On Thursday, September 19th, Katherine DiCrocco graciously hosted our Topic Talk on Paid Family Leave, and Kate Elkins led us in an educational discussion on this very important subject. We appreciate your interest in learning how the Pennsylvania Family Care Act positively affects us all and should be supported by our General Assembly. Unlike many other developed countries, the U.S. has no guarantee of paid vacation, sick days, or family and parental leave. This really strains working families, making it harder to balance responsibilities, stay productive, and recover from illness or injury. If you're among the millions without paid sick days, you might be forced to choose between your job and caring for a sick loved one. We will revisit this very important topic again in the new year.

Election day is almost here and your vote matters. If you are able, please consider offering car pool services to those who may need rides to the polls.

Lastly, we encourage all members to sign up for the Two-Minute Activist. This platform empowers you to have your voices heard. All the tools you need to call or send messages to your members of Congress, or to contact your state legislators about pressing issues will be provided. It only takes two minutes to register!


WE NEED YOUR DONATIONS OF CLOTHING

This campus resource is for ALL students, staff and faculty, and their families.







Today's Gender Pay Gap Data Shows Decline in Progress Towards Equity

Maybe not a surprise—but shocking anyway. Read the <u>September 10, 2024 press release</u> announcing AAUW's identification of the gender pay gap decline.

WE STILL HAVE WORK TO DO

The Gloria Blackwell quote is powerful and outlines our actions.

"These inequities are not perpetuated due to individual women's choices," said Blackwell. "They stem from policies that fail to support working women, including the lack of paid leave, affordable childcare, and comprehensive pay equity laws and practices. It's time we have a serious conversation about how to fix this."

"We cannot allow these disparities to continue unchecked," Ms. Blackwell said. "AAUW recognizes this is a systemic problem, and we won't stop fighting until all women are paid fairly and have the support they need to build secure, equitable futures for themselves and their families."
